IN MEMORIAM:

We are sorry to report the deaths of the following classmates during 1998-1999:

John C. Robinson passed away in October 1998 as a result of pancreatic cancer. John retired at the end of May 1997 after a 29-year career in banking and a second career of seven years as a bank examiner for the State of New Mexico. He had been an international banker with Citibank in Colombia and Ecuador, with Continental Bank in Chicago, and the chief administrative officer for a Chicago merchant bank. He married Donna Minge of Denver in 1958, and they had three sons who are presently an architect in Albuquerque, a licensed surveyor in Phoenix, and an electrical engineer in San Francisco. John and Donna were divorced in 1990, and Donna passed away in January 1997.

In June 1997, John married Lilly Otto and was living in Albuquerque, New Mexico. After his retirement, he undertook consulting assignments to the Central Bank of Armenia, to the Superintendency of Banks of Costa Rica, and was scheduled to serve as a consultant to foreign central banks and bank regulators when illness necessitated an indefinite postponement of this third career. While at Tucson High, John was the Staff Editor of the Cactus Chronicle and was selected to Who's Who.

Jack Levkowitz passed away in December 1998 of cancer. Jack was born to Harry and Clara Levkowitz who had arrived from Odessa, Russia via Chicago to Tucson in 1917 with the first three of their seven children. While at Tucson High, he served on the Senior Council and was a member of the Orchestra. Jack attended the University of Pittsburg Dental School, interned at Montefiore Hospital in Pittsburg, and completed post-doctoral research at the University of Southern California before returning to Tucson with his wife Bertie.

In addition to his private dental practice in Tucson, Jack founded ABC Dental Center and was a pioneer in nutrition and preventive dental care education in public schools. Jack was a Jewish community activist and was co-founder and former president of the Tucson Hebrew Academy. He was personally involved in welcoming and educating Soviet emigres to Tucson. Jack is survived by his wife Bertie, a daughter, a son, granddaughter, two brothers, and a sister.

TUCSON HIGH BADGER FOUNDATION

The Tucson High Badger Foundation held its annual breakfast and meeting in October 1998. The goals of the Foundation are to perpetuate the traditions and history of Tucson High School, to promote the educational and cultural activities of the students and alumni, and to encourage and support its students to graduate. A number of Class of '50 graduates were in attendance to honor the induction of one of our own class members into the Badger Foundation Hall of Fame of **Judge G. Thomas Meehan**, who died October 19, 1993 at the age of 61.

Tom Meehan was a native of Tucson, attended University Heights Grade School, Mansfield Junior High, and Tucson High. Following graduation, he was in the submarine service during the Korean War. He served as a state highway patrolman after the Korean War and received his undergraduate degree in Corrections Administration from the University of Arizona. He worked as a state liquor enforcement agent while he was studying for his law degree from the University of Arizona College of Law. He was in private practice for several years and served as a special court commissioner for the Pima County Superior Court. He became Judge Pro Tempore in 1978 before his appointment as Superior Court Judge. In January 1985, he was named Presiding Judge with administrative duties over 21 divisions.

Tom was known for his common-sense approach to the law, a congenial mix of wisdom, wit, and ornery intolerance for the starched formality that dominates many courtrooms. He was described by colleagues as a "man's man" who grounded his legal rulings in a sensibility linked to his love for the Old West--a life-size cardboard cutout of John Wayne stood in the corner of his office. He was both tough and empathetic--he once sentenced a child molester to 2975 years in prison (the defense attorney got the sentence reduce to 2865 years.). He was quoted as saying, "Who the hell am I to sit and decide what happens to somebody's life." He liked to say he became a lawyer because he was never very good with issues that had right or wrong answers but he demonstrated repeatedly that he could find the right answers. He had no regrets.

Other 1950 Class members who have been inducted into the Hall of Fame are Stanley Feldman, Alba Bustamante Torres, and H. Wilson "Unky" Sundt. Contact either Suzanne Laws Bernard or Margaret Clampitt Bath, both currently serving on the Badger Foundation Board, for details on presenting a nomination for the Hall of Fame. Nominations for the THS Badger Foundation Hall of Fame must be received by April 1, 1999. Dues to the Foundation are \$10 a year and are due by October 15 and delinquent by December 15 of each year.

The Class of 1950 Reunion Committee will continue to accept donations in any amount as we continue to collect funds for Tucson High School and funnel these moneys through THS Badger Foundation. If you want to contribute funds to benefit Tucson High School, send the Class of 1950 Reunion Committee your check **made payable to the THS Badger Foundation**. We will keep records and then forward the funds to the Foundation. Our Class members contributed \$895.00 from October 1997 to October 1998. Grants totaling \$7,592.05 were given by the Foundation to individual students and groups during the past year--from basketball shoes, to testing fees, to travel expenses, club activity expenses, and extra classes.
